After functioning for 32 years as a youth club, Møllevej 22 in Idestrup, the former cooperative store (brugsforening), was going to be torn down. The state of the building was too decrepit and the municipality deemed it unsafe for use. Idestrup could not let this happen – where would the young people then have to go?

The youth club was and is an important asset for the daily life of the village youth. The wish was therefore to revive it, and at the same time modernize it to become a multifunctional house with a café, youth club, overnight accommodation, and social activities. From 2015 to 2017 the organization Idestrup and Omegns Lokalråd (IOLR – Idestrup Local Council) worked tirelessly to procure funds for a large-scale restoration and rebuilding of Møllevej 22. Fortunately we succeeded!

Nowadays, the café is run by Mads Damgaard and Tea Skailand, to the delight of their many guests in Idestrup and the neighbourhood!
